Footpaths

David Marsh, Chairman of Chattisham & Hintlesham PC writes ...

This note first appeared in the Link two years ago, a recent event brought to the attention of the Parish Council requires that it be republished as a timely reminder.

In our two parishes we are blessed with many footpaths, allowing as they do, quiet walks, some between the two villages and others to neighbouring ones. By and large, our local landowners do a very good job of helping keep them passable and clearly defined. It is a shame then that some people see fit to feel that they are entitled to walk anywhere they choose and ignore these official rights of way. They are not. If you ignore the footpath and just take the shortest, most convenient route across a farmer's land, you are trespassing. Most of the land surrounding us is in commercial use for crop growing and other areas are used for shooting too. By deviating from the designated footpaths, you are risking damaging crops and if you are in an area used for shooting, possibly yourself!

In this recent event, the landowner, when pointing out these facts to the walker, was verbally abused. This is both unwarranted and unacceptable behaviour.

Full details of all the official footpaths are given on the village website under "Footpath". Please only use these when out enjoying our great countryside. Thank you.

NOTES FROM THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL ON THURSDAY 9th JANUARY 2020 at 7.30pm

Present at the meeting were all 12 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Christopher Hudson and 4 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from District Councillor Dave Busby.

County Council Report: It was a pleasure to see the return of Cllr Christopher Hudson, especially after a somewhat extended break. His reports, a mixture of comment, fact and sometimes hyperbole are always worth hearing. He will be reporting back to the PC the results of the nine-month aerodynamic study of the Orwell Bridge recently undertaken by City University, London, which was commissioned by Highways England, but apparently funded by Suffolk County Council to the tune of £9 million. However, his claim that the bridge is nearing the end of its useful life might come as a surprise to Highways England who expect it to last until the year 2100.

As previously announced, Helen Rogerson has stepped down from her dual role of collating both The Village Link and also the village website and I would like to add my thanks for all the good work she has done over the past few years. Gerald Main, the curator of the excellent War Memorial website, <http://hintleshamwarmemorial.com/> has taken on The Village Link, while Hintlesham newcomer Haydon Wilding will be curating and developing

the village website.

Haydon is Suffolk born and bred and has a wealth of experience in both the commercial and the voluntary I.T. sectors, and I look forward to his innovations and any training he might see fit to give.
