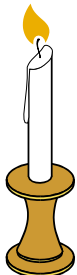

## NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL ON THURSDAY 14<sup>th</sup> September 2017 at 7.30 pm

---

Present at the meeting were 9 Parish Councillors, District Councillor Nick Ridley and 6 members of the public. Apologies were received from County Councillor Christopher Hudson, District Councillor Barry Gasper and Parish Councillors Stuart Kellet, Jamie Bostock and John Whyman.

**Multi Use Games Area (MUGA);** The Parish Council unanimously passed the following resolution; *We agree to allow the construction of this project on land the subject of a lease agreement with Chattisham & Hintlesham Community Council, contrary to the existing lease terms and conditions.* Disappointingly, no one from the MUGA working party or any senior member of the various Community Council groups felt able to speak on behalf of this resolution. However, in their absence Stephanie Coupland gave a passionate speech in support of the project.

**Babergh & Mid Suffolk Joint Local Plan;** This document is now out for public consultation until November 10th 2017. Our nearest drop in event will be at Hadleigh Town Hall, Market Place, Hadleigh IP7 5DN on the 11th October, 2pm to 7 pm. Cllr Nick Ridley said that the Plan was not likely to be adopted for another 15 months, and unfortunately in the meantime developers could “drive a horse and cart” through existing planning guidelines. Of course, it hasn’t helped that recent decisions taken by Babergh’s Planning Committee that are

against both local and national guidelines, have not only unbolted the stable door but have also saddled up the horses.

**Babergh & Mid Suffolk DC’s Merger;** Having dismissed any talk of it for the last 2 years, Cllr Ridley admitted that there have recently been discussions on a proposed merger of the two District Councils. In answer to a question as to whether there would be a public referendum to decide the matter, Nick said that this was not a requirement under current rules, and in addition, the cost of a referendum was a prohibitive £100,000. We now know the price of democracy in Babergh.

### **Planning;**

DC/17/04460 – Linden Cottages – Erection of front porch addition to No’s 1,2 & 3 Linden Cottages. Erection of two storey extension and alterations to No 3 Linden Cottages. The council discussed the application and had no objections.

Although not as violent as the Pankhurst family and the London members who got the most publicity, the ladies of Ipswich were still a force to be reckoned with, burning down unoccupied buildings including the Bath Hotel, a luxurious hotel on the front at Felixstowe. They also organised marches and rallies where hundreds turned out.

We were particularly interested to hear about Miss Olive Beamish, a very active member who spent the latter part of her life in Duke Street. She had also done some burning of buildings as well as a railway station in Surrey. Like most of the other ladies who had committed "crimes" she suffered the dreadful experience of force feeding.

Our next speaker for October is Mrs Mary Moore who spent forty years as a blacksmith at a forge near Woodbridge. On 24th October we have a visit to Daws Hall in Bures, Essex, planned where the autumn foliage is supposed to be spectacular. Will members intending to come please bring the entrance fee of £6 with them to our meeting on the 3rd October.
