POLICE CONNECT

Keeping you informed, keeping your community safe

Members of the public are being invited to support Suffolk Constabulary by becoming the “eyes and ears” of their communities as part of a new initiative.

The Local Policing Volunteer pilot scheme, which was originally launched across six towns and villages in April, has now been opened up to the whole county and has already attracted early interest but spaces remain for further dedicated individuals.

As part of the non-uniform role, volunteers become accessible points of contact for their communities and help Suffolk Constabulary to detect crime by promoting effective communication and the prompt reporting of suspicious and criminal activity in each area.

Volunteers are not expected to become involved in any incident where conflict or threat exists and will have no power of arrest or detention. They are there to report anything suspicious or unusual directly to the police. They will receive full induction training and have access to their local police station to attend appropriate briefings.

Local Policing Volunteers are an important element of our police family, which includes police officers, PCSOs, police staff and the Specials.

Local Policing Volunteers:

- must be aged over 18 years (no upper age limit)
- can work up to a maximum of 20 hours per week
- are not required to wear a uniform
- will be covered by public liability insurance wherever they undertake their volunteering duties.

Anyone interested in becoming a Local Policing Volunteer will undergo training, be given a tabard and have a direct point of contact with police, as well as be included in regular meetings. The supportive role is also designed to work alongside usual activities and at no point requires participants to directly get involved in tackling crime.

Volunteers will need to undergo and pass security checks at the appropriate level for the role, although no medical assessment is required.

NOTES FROM THE MEETING of the PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held in the COMMUNITY HALL on THURSDAY 12th JULY 2018 at 7.30 pm

Present at the meeting were 9 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Christopher Hudson, District Councillor Nick Ridley and 4 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from Stuart Kellet, Debbie Archer, Jamie Bostock and Barry Gasper.

Chattisham Open Gardens; Diane Chase reported that the recent open garden day had raised a record amount of £2770. Diane and Roger deserve a huge round of applause for the all the hard work and dedication they put in to organising this splendid biennial event.

County Council Report; Although Cllr Hudson supplies us with a generic Suffolk Parish Report, he seems to have taken his eye off the ball with regard to our local issues. It is now 6 months since a meeting was requested with Suffolk Highways to discuss safety issues on the A1071, with an adequate response still outstanding, and a similar amount of time has lapsed since a request was made to Suffolk MP and Digital Minister Matt Hancock to provide a real and accurate timescale for the roll out of fast broadband in our Parishes. Obviously, we will be waiting a long time for a response from Matt Hancock as he has now left that Government Department.

District Council Report; Nick Ridley said that according to the latest figures, Babergh now had a 5 Year Land Supply, indeed they now have a land supply of 6.7 years, which set against the figure of 4.1 years which was announced in May 2017, is a surprising 60% increase.

According to a statement released by Nick and his Mid Suffolk counterpart David Whybrow;

“We’ve had to take some tough decisions over the past few years, and more than once some of our Planning Committee Members found themselves sitting for 12 hours a day, but that hard work has now paid off”

Now I thought it was achieved by entering the correct data onto a spreadsheet according to a government prescribed formula, more accurately and more regularly.

Multi Use Games Area; The Grand Opening of the MUGA took place on Sunday 15th July and by all accounts was a tremendous success. The MUGA court is available for tennis, netball and 5 a-side football, basketball (hoop one end only) and hockey (goals to come once funding secured). It can be booked through the third party www.fastcourts.com/clubs/HCMUGA. Initially use is restricted to members of our community or those with strong ties; this is to ensure the maximum opportunity for our community to use this exciting new facility.

Only members of our MUGA Club and guests accompanied by those members may use the facility. All members agree to our Terms of Use by placing a booking. This is to ensure everyone who uses the court is aware of how to look after our community's facility so that everyone can continue to enjoy using it for years to come. The court is located on the playing field opposite the Church and Community Hall in Hintlesham and has a lighting facility with use limited until 22:00 to respect our local residents.
