**NOTES FROM THE MEETING of the PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held in the COMMUNITY HALL on THURSDAY 8th NOVEMBER 2018 at 7.30 pm**

---

Present at the meeting were 7 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Christopher Hudson, District Councillors Nick Ridley and Barry Gasper and 7 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from John Whyman, Ian Bryce and Frances Self.

**County Council Report;** As part of his monthly report, Councillor Hudson said that Suffolk is now in line with national figures with 64% of students in the county achieving the standard pass in English and Maths. Suffolk is also in the top half of all authorities for achieving the threshold of grade 5 in English and Maths, and has risen by 40 places in national league tables for this measure, to 43 out of 151 authorities.

**District Council Reports;** Councillor Ridley said that the latest Joint Local Plan had been delayed by up to 6 months. This is due to Babergh releasing their 5 Year Land Supply figure the week before the latest guidance in the National Planning Policy Framework. As the NPPF had changed then it was likely that the calculations for the 5 year Land Supply were inaccurate.

Cllr Gasper reported that the Babergh Constitution was having to be re-written as it did not take into account the change to Cabinet Governance. As this change occurred last May 2017, it would appear that Babergh are yet again making decisions based on hindsight rather than foresight.

**Stars of Babergh Awards 2018;** As previously reported, Diane Chase and Audrey Lorford were finalists in the Community Project of the Year Category for their work in producing Hintlesham

& Chattisham; The Story of Two Suffolk Villages. On the night, the judges preferred a community housing scheme by Lavenham PC, but this does not detract from their fantastic achievement.

**Suffolk's Most Active Community Award (Small Village category);** Hurrah, our villages have won first prize for the Multi-Use Games Area. The judges were particularly impressed with our communities achievement in raising £117,000 to provide an all-weather floodlit facility which gives residents free access to tennis, hockey, five-side football and netball.
