**NOTES FROM THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN
THE COMMUNITY HALL ON THURSDAY 14th NOVEMBER 2019 at 7.30pm**

Present at the meeting were 11 Parish Councillors, District Councillor Dave Busby and 10 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from Chris Leney.

District Council Report; Cllr Busby confirmed that there would be free swimming at the Hadleigh Pool for young people over the Christmas school holidays, but advised that people would need to register before hand. In answer to a query at October’s meeting regarding a development proposal by Gladman Land on the edge of Hintlesham, Cllr Busby had been informed by Babergh’s Deputy Chief Planning Officer that no letter of intent had been received, and in consequence the proposal would not be included in the next Joint Local Plan. In answer to another question, Cllr Busby stated that the 50% increase in interest rates by the Public Works Loan Board would not have an immediate detrimental effect on the profitability of Cifco Capital Ltd, Babergh DC’s property development company.

Member of the public; Richard Young informed the meeting that the police speedwatch officer had caught 11 speeding motorists during a recent session at Silver Hill, George Street, Hintlesham. She also informed him that the police now considered this an area of “high interest”.

VAS Road Sign Update; After the presentation of a comprehensive report by David Marsh, the Parish Council has decided to purchase 2 Evolis signs. One

is currently in use in Capel St Mary. Two operating sites in Duke street and two sites in George Street have also been chosen. Full details of the cameras and sites and costs will appear in the minutes of this meeting. The Parish Council thanked David Marsh for the work he has put in on this project and were also very grateful to County Councillor Christopher Hudson, who has agreed to fund 65% of the total cost of cameras and support poles.

On a night of decision making, the Parish Council also agreed the siting of two new Dog Mess bins on Duke Street.

Planning;

- DC/19/04798 – Land Between Belfry Cottage and Pear Tree Cottage, north of George Street, Hintlesham – Change of Use of Land and erection of 4 no. single storey dwellings and 4 no. two storey dwellings and creation of vehicular access. Parish Council Objected.
- DC/19/05120 – Kiln Cottage, Silver Hill, Hintlesham – Erection of a first floor side extension. No objection by the Parish Council.
