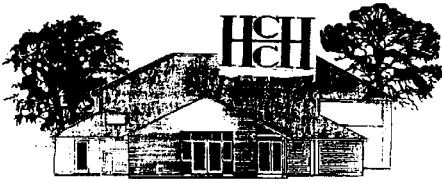

NOTES FROM THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL ON THURSDAY 13TH DECEMBER 2018 at 7.30 pm

Present at the meeting were 7 Parish Councillors, District Councillors Barry Gasper and Nick Ridley and 4 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from County Councillor Christopher Hudson and Parish Councillors Frances Self, Jamie Bostock and Stephanie Coupland.

County Council Report;

As Councillor Hudson was not present at the meeting we were unable to find out the details of his recent meeting with local MP James Carlidge. We look forward to our January meeting to hear what pearls of wisdom our MP has to offer regarding local planning issues.

District Council Reports;

Barry Gasper told the meeting that the dire financial situation at Babergh DC was reaching a critical position and that there would have to be some tough talking at the full Council meeting in January.

Orwell Green Village; is the name of a proposed development of 2600 houses to be built in the Ipswich/Bucklesham area, about which there is currently a public consultation. Nick Ridley was asked what Babergh's strategy is to deal with such an eventuality. As Cabinet Member for Planning Cllr Ridley made several less than coherent comments until Cllr Gasper interjected, and said that now that he was aware of the issue he would make sure that Babergh would have a robust response.

Planning;

DC/18/04936 - Gardenia House, Duke Street, Hintlesham - Erection of Single Storey Rear Extension

DC/18/0988 - Land South East of Duke Street, (Dukes Park Development)

Hintlesham - Erection of 3 no. Dwellings

The Parish Council and the attending members of the public were dismayed that an application was being made to build 3 houses on the land set aside for leisure and amenity value. It was strongly argued that the provision of amenity land was a material factor in granting the original planning permission for the site. The Parish Council voted to reject the application and expect Babergh's Planning Enforcement to defend their own stipulations.
