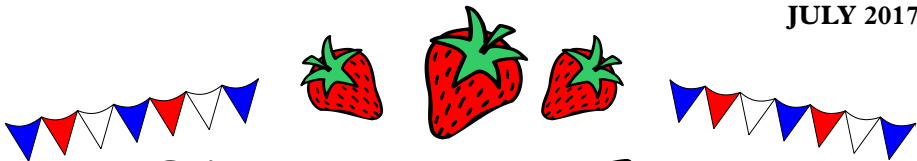

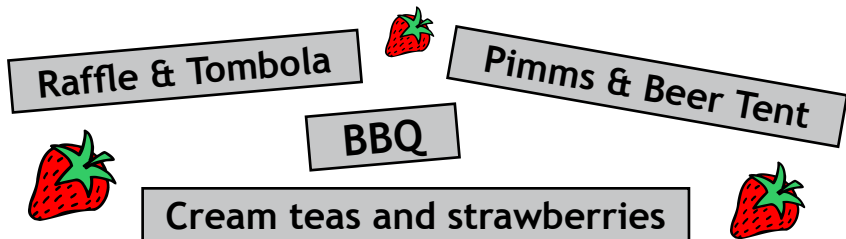

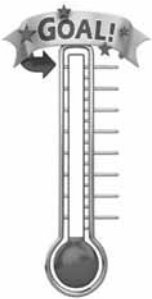

**NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE
COMMUNITY HALL ON THURSDAY 8th June 2017 at 7.30 pm**

Present at the meeting were 9 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Christopher Hudson, District Councillor Nick Ridley and 4 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from Barry Gasper, John Whyman, Stuart Kellet and Diane Chase.

George Street Road Safety; Richard Young, a resident of George Street, informed the meeting that a Police Official had been taking speed readings outside his property on 7 separate occasions this year, starting in early February and finishing on May 31st. This has resulted in 126 motorists be reported for prosecution for exceeding the 30 mph speed limit.

County Council Report; In a brief report, Cllr Hudson informed the meeting that the A1071 through Hintlesham was a dangerous road, and something needed to be done to improve road safety.

District Council Report: Nick Ridley has been selected as Chair of Babergh's Planning Committee and Barry Gasper has been selected as Chair of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee. Although well over 1000 Planning Applications have been approved in the past 12 months, Cllr Ridley informed the meeting that Babergh did not have the required 5 Year Land Supply. This was likely to result in pressure from developers to build houses on land that had previously been protected under national and local planning policies. It was likely to take Babergh a further 12 months until yet another Local Plan could be introduced to provide some protection from over development.

Defibrillators Funding; Stephanie Coupland announced that she had managed to acquire £1000 in donations towards funding a defibrillator to be sited in the old telephone box in Duke Street, Hintlesham. Stephanie would like to thank everyone who has made this commitment.
