

**NOTES FROM THE MEETING of the PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held in
the COMMUNITY HALL on THURSDAY 14th JUNE 2018 at 7.30 pm**

Present at the meeting were 7 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Christopher Hudson, District Councillor Nick Ridley and 4 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from Barry Gasper, Ian Bryce, Jamie Bostock and Stephanie Coupland.

MUGA Update; The second layer of tarmac has been laid which just leaves the finishing layer of Astroturf style carpet to be put down. There will also be a wide tarmac path leading to the Community Hall car park which will be ideal for disabled access.

County Council Report; In addition to his written report which had been previously circulated, Christopher Hudson gave a long and detailed report on future funding options for school travel. It is fair to say that funding will be reduced along with services provided.

District Council Report; Nick Ridley stated that Babergh DC would be choosing the option for the redevelopment of their vacated Cork Lane Headquarters on Tuesday 19th June. All 3 of the schemes under consideration are for residential use. When questioned as to how many units would be low cost or affordable, Cllr Ridley said that there wouldn't be any as this would make the scheme financially unviable. When further questioned as

to how as the land owner and potential developer they were unable to provide the statutory affordable homes, Cllr Ridley was unable to provide an adequate response. When it was pointed out that the District Council was hardly setting a good example to other developers, Cllr Ridley was equally non-committal.

Nick Riley also reported that elected Members had awarded themselves a substantial increase in attendance allowance. For example, the Council Leader and Cabinet Members would receive an increase of well over 50%. The total increase would add an extra £80,000 a year to the Council's already stretched budget.


