Dear All,

In the autumn last year, we did a course called, 'Faith Pictures', helping us to find ways of talking about our faith. A 'faith picture' is something personal to each person which illustrates how their faith relates to their life experiences. This month I thought I would talk about my 'faith picture':

It is of a walk through the woods. The path twists and turns and sometimes becomes difficult to follow. My life has felt like that at times. Sometimes it's a bit dark and scary when the trees are thick and close in on me. At other times there is great beauty as shafts of sunlight pierce the canopy and light up a carpet of bluebells.

Paths in the woods often twist and turn, there is no direct path to the destination and I can't see round the next corner to see what lies ahead. At times it feels like I'm going in the

wrong direction, so I need to trust that the path I have chosen will lead to the destination God has promised. There are sometimes forks in the path where I need to make a decision. At these points a map is useful, and my map is the bible. But maps are best used if you follow them closely all the time, rather than just when you think you might have gone wrong!

But the best bit is when I realise that I have a companion on the journey. I am not alone in the woods, because I have Jesus walking beside me.

I wonder, if you have a faith, what picture you might choose to represent your faith? Think about it, then share it with a trusted friend, or perhaps one of us. It would be lovely to hear.

May you know God's presence and guidance in whatever life experiences you are going through at this time.

Kagera Lent Appeal

During Lent we have been raising money across the benefice for the Diocese of Kagera in Tanzania, which our diocese in Suffolk is linked to. Like many other parts of Africa, Kagera has been suffering from drought and the resulting famine, probably due to climate change. The churches of our benefice (Elmsett, Aldham, Kersey, Hintlesham and Chattisham) have taken on the Kagera Lent Challenge, a booklet which gives a snippet of information about Kagera and something to do each day. For example:

15th March: Most houses in Kagera do not have electricity. They have to use kerosene lamps for lighting. Give 1p for every electric light in your house.

7th April: Coffee and tea are grown in the north of Kagera region. Give 10p for every cup of tea or coffee you drink today.

Thanks to generous giving in our churches we raised over £600 for Kagera during Lent. We also decided to give the collection from the Deanery Service held at Hintlesham on 30th April, which came to over £400 after expenses had been taken. So a cheque for nearly £1100 is been sent. Well done and thanks to all who helped raise such a fantastic total!

B/17/01088 - Chattisham Hall, Application for listed building consent – Erection of single storey side extension to existing outbuilding for use with swimming pool. There were no objections, however a footpath currently runs through the development and this will be mentioned in the Parish Council response.

B/17/01060 - Land to the west of Duke Street – change of use from agricultural to gardens to serve Whisper Cottage, Phalmier, Gardenia House, The Dell, The Old Bakery and The Old Chapel. There were no objections



Golf Day 2017



The golf day was played under a cloudy sky and a stiff breeze added to the challenge.

We had a record entry of 15 teams including both new faces and regular entrants; an encouraging number of players from previous years had introduced new golfers to the day. A team from Brett Vale, Mark's Replacements, won the team competition with an impressive 135 points, a record winning score. The Growlers (Glen Avis, Keith Bell, Neville Simpson and Mark Blades) showed their usual strong form and came second alongside new entrants the Felixstowe Sailors, both teams 9 points behind the winners.

Graeme Murray of the Old Recs won the individual trophy (which had been beautifully enhanced with a plinth by last year's winner Francis Law) for the best score (38 points) by a player not in a prize winning team; Sam Saunders and Paul Frostick won the nearest the pin prizes.

With the help of generous donations from a number of local companies that made donations for the raffle, the event raised £918 and through Mark Deakin's assistance this amount has been matched by Barclays Bank so that in total £1,836 has been raised for the church restoration fund. This result means that we have now broken through the £10,000 mark from the 10 golf days held to date.

I would like to thank all of the many organisations and individuals that played or donated prizes, and Julia Faulds, Julia Woolley, Angela Belli, Jill Warner and Peter Hollis for all of their work in helping to run the day. Special thanks also go to Henry and all of his team at Hintlesham Golf Club for helping make the day a success.
