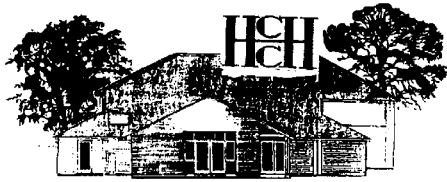

Police are warning residents to be alert for telephone scams after an attempted fraud was foiled in the Ipswich area.

The incident occurred on Wednesday 9th May when the victim received a call from a person purporting to be from HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC), stating that he was being investigated for an historic tax fraud. For further information go to: HMRC scam
