Many, many thanks to everyone who supported the Macmillan Tea Party on Friday 28th September. Special thanks to those who made cakes and for all those who came to eat them!



**NOTES FROM THE MEETING of the PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held in the COMMUNITY HALL on THURSDAY 11th OCTOBER 2018 at 7.30 pm**

---

Present at the meeting were 10 Parish Councillors, District Councillors Nick Ridley and Barry Gasper and County Councillor Christopher Hudson and 3 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from Chris Leney and Stuart Kellet. Regrettably, Stuart Kellet has also resigned from the Parish Council.

**Number 90 Bus Service;** It has been agreed that the service will continue until March 2019 and then be subject to another review. It goes without saying that this is a case of “use it or lose it”.

**Stars of Babergh Awards 2018;** Both Audrey Lorford and Diane Chase have been nominated for an award in recognition of their magnificent tome Hintlesham & Chattisham; The Story of Two Suffolk Villages. The award ceremony will have taken place at St Mary’s Church Hadleigh on October 18th, hosted by Radio Suffolk DJ, Mark Murphy.

**County Council Report;** Christopher Hudson reported that Suffolk CC had to make funding cuts of £25 million to their 2019/20 budget. He also stated that the projected cost of the Orwell Crossings had risen from £97 million to £140 million, and that as Suffolk CC couldn’t provide the extra finance, it was likely that the project would be abandoned. Cllr Hudson was asked why the £20 million that Suffolk CC would be contributing to the scheme could not be used to fund Social Care for vulnerable residents instead. Cllr Hudson, prompted by Cllr Ridley, then explained that the funding for the Orwell Crossing was from

the Capital Account, and so could not be used for anything other than capital projects.

This is an interesting argument, as at the previous Parish Council meeting, we were informed that Babergh DC had used funds from their Capital Account to balance last year’s budget, and in all likelihood would have to do the same thing this year.

It was also reported that Suffolk CC would be holding two “We Are Listening” events in October. Apparently, there are as yet no plans to hold any “We have taken any notice and are going to do something about it” events.

**District Council Report;** Cllr Barry Gasper said that the Scrutiny Committee was looking into the effectiveness of the Suffolk Crime Partnership, specifically the so-called County Lines drug problem. He stressed that the success of this scheme was reliant on information provided by members of the public.
