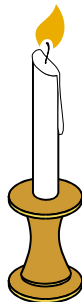
11.00am – 2 minute silence at the War Memorial

NOTES FROM THE MEETING of the PARISH COUNCIL MEETING held in the COMMUNITY HALL on THURSDAY 13th SEPTEMBER 2018 at 7.30 pm

Present at the meeting were 6 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Christopher Hudson, District Councillor Barry Gasper and 3 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from Nick Ridley, Frances Self, Diane Chase, Jamie Bostock, Stuart Kellet, John Whyman and Ben Cox.

Highways meeting: Chris Leney gave a report on a much delayed meeting with Suffolk Highways personnel, arranged to discuss the state of roads in our 2 villages and especially pinch points on the A1071. This meeting was particularly apposite, as days later a Bartram’s lorry loaded with bricks was driven into a ditch on the A1071 opposite Hintlesham Hall, resulting in the destruction of a telegraph pole and the wiring carrying telephone and internet cables to over 30 homes and businesses. At the time of writing this problem had yet to be rectified.

Suffolk Highways stated that they had no spare funding in their budget and would not be doing anything to improve the conditions of our roads.

District Councillor Barry Gasper reported that a planning application to build 478 homes at Wolsey Grange had been passed recently by Babergh’s Planning Committee. He didn’t have any information as to why this application had superseded the outline planning application for around 140 new homes that was passed last year, and as planning supremo Nick Ridley was absent from the meeting we are none the wiser.

Perhaps this is how Babergh have managed to achieved their 5 Year Land Supply figure.

Cllr. Gasper also reported that there was a £1 million deficit in the current budget and that Chief Executive Arthur Charvonia has yet to provide the Scrutiny Committee with a coherent business plan to alleviate the

deficit.

County Councillor Christopher Hudson had provided the meeting with 2 comprehensive County Council reports for July and August. One of his personal initiatives has been to negotiate a fare of 87 pence a day for Suffolk One students to use the Park and Ride bus service from Ipswich Town centre to the terminus situated adjacent to the Tesco Copdock store. This would reduce the amount of “nuisance” car parking which adversely affects local residents when driveways are blocked and all street parking places are taken by students. Cllr. Hudson said that feed-back he had received agreed with the aims of the scheme but some students thought that the walk from the bus stop to the college was too far.

Village Directory: Stephanie Coupland reported that she had received donations from various companies and private individuals to fund the printing of 500 copies of the updated Directory. The purpose of the Directory is to have all the contact details of social groups, local businesses etc in one handy booklet, and hopefully will help new arrivals to our villages become part of our community.

DEFIBRILLATORS

Last month the British Heart Foundation with the NHS and Microsoft launched a new scheme aimed at mapping out the location of public access defibrillators (PADS) across the UK that can be used by local ambulance services.

This initiative is in response to shocking figures that show PADs are used in less than 3% of out-of-hospital cardiac arrests, significantly reducing the survival chances of tens of thousands of people every year.

We are fortunate to have 3 defibrillators in Hintlesham and Chattisham at the following locations:

- red telephone box, Duke Street, Hintlesham
- outside entrance to Community Hall, Hintlesham
- red telephone box, The Street, Chattisham

Defibrillators are easy to use – the machine gives clear spoken instructions on how to proceed so you don't need training to use one.

Should you come across someone who has stopped breathing or is breathing erratically, the most important thing to do is call 999 and **start CPR** – every minute without CPR and defibrillations reduces the chances of survival by 10%. If you're on your own, **don't interrupt the CPR to go and get a defibrillator**. If possible, send someone else.

Once the defibrillator is open and in position, just follow the instructions. The machine detects the heart's rhythm and won't deliver a shock unless one is needed. The 999 operator will also be able to advise you on what to do until the ambulance arrives.
