We look back too on many happy memories in the parishes: the annual H&C holiday club, the birth of Mini Messy Church in all of the parishes, successful projects to enhance church facilities in 3 churches, links with the schools, along with those times when we have seen the Lord at work in various ways. We have also met a huge number of people and been privileged to share those more intimate family moments of baptisms, marriages and funerals.

We came here after only a few years of ministry. We move on as experienced rural parish priests, confident in God's guiding and equipping. And the churches of this benefice can face the future confident too in God's provision. Inevitably there will be a period of interregnum, but that is no reason for the churches to stand still! The local leadership - of elders and wardens - is very experienced, and so we pray they will all look to the future, and encourage the churches to move forward in God's plans. We are delighted that there are those in all the parishes who are seeking to extend


community links, and we hope that the new leadership, when it comes, finds churches with a vision for serving their communities and sharing the good news of Jesus.

On **September 5th** we will also enjoy some **local history when Joy Bounds** is coming to speak about the various Suffragettes who were born in and around Ipswich and their activities.


