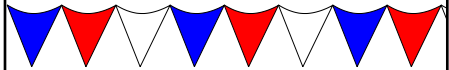

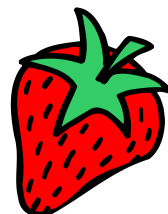

**NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING AND
THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL
ON THURSDAY 12th MAY 2016 at 7.30 pm.**

Present at the meeting were 10 Parish Councillors, County Councillor David Busby, District Councillors Nick Ridley and Barry Gasper and 3 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from Ian Bryce and Stuart Kellet.

Multi Use Games Area Update;

It was decided that a Working Group should be formed to report progress of this project back to the Parish Council. It is expected that the Working Group will present the results of the recent consultation plus an accurate breakdown of the costs of the project at the next Parish Council meeting.

East Anglia Combined Authority(Devolution);

It is apparent that none of our 3 District and County Councillors has the full facts regarding devolution in the so called Eastern Region. What is known is that the combined Councils must submit their proposal by the end of June, and that any public consultation will take place after the proposal is made and not before. What happens after the June deadline passes is then open to speculation. Will there be a Mayor? Will the Mayor lead a Cabinet? How much will all this cost? If the June deadline is not met, will the Government impose it's own agenda? Who knows.

District Councillors Annual Report;

Affordable Housing-The Core Strategy identifies targets to meet the Affordable Housing requirement. However, there is difficulty in maintaining the projected figures because of reductions due to the developer's use of the planning process. Wolsey Grange is a typical example of

this, where the requirement for 35% was reduced to less than 20%. This is an area of concern and needs to be addressed.

Enterprise Zones - Last November the chancellor announced, that Babergh together with the New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership secured one of the government's prestigious Enterprise Zones in Sproughton to cover the old Sugar Beet Site, now owned by Ipswich Borough, with a major redevelopment plan coming forward later this year.

Neighbourhood Plan – Some parishes in Babergh (Lavenham and East Bergholt) have developed Neighbourhood Plans, but the work and investment needed both in cash and man-hours are a challenge to all but the largest villages/towns and their effectiveness to withstand developers' planning applications is still to be put to the test. **Capital Grants** are provided to the community to support village halls, community centres, sports clubs, community shops and events. In 2015/16 £104,355 was allocated across Babergh. Against a total project cost of £420,649, our support of 25% grant allocation levered in a further 75% funding for our communities.

County Council Annual Report;

Cost cutting – the administration have ruled out council tax increases – even to keep pace with a low level of inflation, yet all services are facing increasing

demand. We have seen a number of children centres closed and proposals to shut fire stations and reduce the number of crews coming to a conclusion. There will be a new way of delivering rural transport – it is going to be a challenge to keep services going with a £700,000 cut in their subsidy. This year will see similar discussions with the Park & Ride service and libraries. **Highways** have suffered from a confusing management structure but hopefully this year that will be clearer and we will see an improvement in the state of our roads. Going forward the ‘explosion’ in housing developments are going to add a strain on the infrastructure – roads, schools and doctors’ surgeries. We have a difficult balance to make between providing the houses our residents need and rushing into over development.

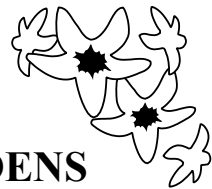
