

**NOTES FROM THE PARISH MEETING FOR HINTLESHAM and CHATTISHAM
HELD in THE COMMUNITY HALL on THURSDAY 9th JULY 2015 at 7.30pm.**

Present at the meeting were 11 Parish Councillors, County Councillor David Busby, District Councillor Barry Gasper and 3 members of the public. Apologies for absence were received from District Councillor Nick Ridley.

Vehicle Activated Signs; Mark Murphy of BBC Radio Suffolk has become aware of Suffolk County Councils decision not to provide a VAS speed sign on the A1071 close to the Village School, and is keen to help us acquire one. Be prepared to hear various Parish Councillors being interviewed while you enjoy your cornflakes.

Consultancy Costs to Babergh DC; In response to an enquiry made at the last Parish Council meeting, District Councillor Barry Gasper had asked Babergh Finance Mike Evans to provide a detailed breakdown of consultancy costs incurred by Babergh in the last financial year. Mr Evans had agreed to provide this information at a forthcoming meeting. Cllr Gasper reported that unfortunately the meeting finished before Mr Evans could provide the information. He is now more motivated to receive an answer.

Crime Report for June 2015; There were no crimes reported for Chattisham and only one crime reported for Hintlesham in this period. Although these low crime figures are reassuring, it might be that some victims of crime don't report crimes to the police. It cannot be overstated how important it is that all crimes are reported to the police as not reporting will only lead the police to use their resources in other areas.

Community Speedwatch; Frances Self reported that the Speedwatch Team were in action again on the 22nd and 23rd of June, and that although the 23rd was a Saturday, and traffic was considerably lighter than a weekday, they still reported 15 speeding motorists to the police.

The Speedwatch Team are still looking for residents to join the team. If you are concerned at traffic speeding through

Hintlesham, now is your chance to make a difference.

Suffolk County Council Report; Cllr Busby reported that at the financial year end for 2014/15 the revenue budget has been underspent by £2.3m, equivalent to 0.4% of the net budget. This budget included a target for planned savings of £38.6m to reach a balanced budget as part of a four year savings plan of £156m (at that stage) for 2014/15 to 2017/18. Disappointingly, an underspend of £1.7m occurred in the Children & Young People directorate, which considering the lack of progress with the Raising the Bar initiative is baffling. The capital programme spent £107.1m against a budget of £171.4m. The Council is hoping to refinance the capital cost of the Energy from Waste site, saving the Council an estimated £1m per year over 24 years.

Babergh District Council Report; Cllr Gasper said that various District Councillors had been part of a recent fact finding tour of the old British Sugar site at Sproughton Road. Various schemes have been proposed for the site, including the use of the hoppers by a pet food company, however until a planning application is received this is all speculation.

£106 Monies; The Parish Clerk reported that Nick Elliott of Babergh DC had again refused to release funds to pay for remedial work to the play areas adjacent to the Community Hall, and that he requires a more comprehensive Village Survey before he will do so. The Parish Council will now look at a range of uses for these funds.

The Parish Council has received Accreditation as Data Handlers from the Information Commissioner's Office. This will help in future surveys, particularly with regard to the proposed Neighbourhood Plan.

The Parish Council have informed Babergh Planning department that Planning Application B/15/00755/FUL contravenes their Planning Policy CS2 and therefore expects them to reject this application out of hand.
