PARISH COUNCIL MEETING Notes from Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 11th January 2024

Report from County/District Councillors

John Wyman reported from Babergh District Council that there is a predicted budget deficit for 2024 of approx. £1 million. There are two key areas being considered for bringing in new funds:

-Additional Council Tax charges for second homeowners

-Car parking charges.

The current free car parks cost the Council approx. \pounds 425,000 per year to run and options to cover these costs are being developed. Careful consideration is being given to methods of payment and options of retaining a short period of free parking, so as not to disadvantage any elements of the community over others, especially the elderly. Decisions will be made in March 2024.

Reports from Members of the Public

A member of the public reported significant issues of flooding on several footpaths in HIntlesham and Chattisham. Until the recent flooding recedes it will not be possible to make any significant amendments, then an assessment of likely improvements will be made.

Flooding in Lower Barn Road Chattisham has been reported to Suffolk Council.

It was noted that a number of road signs have been damaged/knocked over in the recent storms. Any resident seeing damage to road signs, pavements, roadways etc and potholes, can report these to Suffolk Council Highways, preferably with a photograph, on the interactive reporting site: Suffolk County Council – Report IT

A member of the public raised objections to the revised planning application which has been submitted for the land on Duke Street adjacent to The Cottage. These objections were supported by the Parish Council and are covered below.

Planning Applications

DC/23 05701 Land adjacent to The Cottage, Duke Street. Further to an approved planning application for a 3 bedroom/2 bathroom home with a garage on this site, a new owner has submitted a revised application for a much larger 4 bedroom/4 bathroom house without a garage. The Parish Council has lodged objections to the revised plan on the basis that the design over develops the plot, is much larger, taller and of a different style to the previous design, the increased capacity for access and parking of associated cars was of concern, especially at this narrow point of the road on a bend.

Precept Budget

The Parish Council budget for 2024/5 has been set at £9,422, being an increase of 6% or £530. The main areas of planned expenditure remain: Publication of The Link,

Grass Cutting, Insurance, Parish Clerk's salary, Steet lights, Bin emptying, Audit and administrative costs.

Police Forum Update

Suffolk Constabulary has been restructured under the new Chief Constable. The Force has 3 teams;

Community Policing Teams, replacing Safer Neighbourhoods Teams, supporting smaller areas to have a better understanding of local concerns.

Response Investigation Teams, replacing Neighbourhood Response Teams, providing initial response to emergency and non-emergency incidents and investigating crime.

Community Partnership and Prevention Hub-this will help prevent crime and antisocial behaviour, working together with local councils, social services, health, education and other agencies.

There is a new Police.uk website where you can access local crime and antisocial behaviour data.

There has been an increase in thefts from sheds and cloning of electronic car keys across the County.

Next meeting: 8th February, members of the public welcome.
