RULES (Read Carefully)

- 1 The Society will be called the Hintlesham Gardening Club and its objects shall be the encouragement of Horticulture and kindred subjects in the district.
- 2 Membership of the Society shall be open to all Parishes. Any person may become a member of the Society on an annual payment of $\pounds 2.00$ by 1st January.
- 3 Entry fees free for members; 20p for non-members. All children free.
- 4 Every specimen shown must have been grown by or have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least three months previous to show. The committee reserve the right to examine garden or glasshouse of exhibitor before or after the show.
- 5 Exhibitors using any means to deceive the judges will forfeit all prizes and be debarred from competing in any future competition. Particular attention is drawn to Rule 4.
- 6 The judges will be empowered to withhold prizes if they consider the exhibits do not merit them.
- 7 The closing date for entries is Wednesday before show. All entries by telephone to Cathy Leney 01473 652123 or via email park.farm1@ btinternet.com.
- 8 The Shows to be opened at 1.30 p.m. EXHIBITS TO BE STAGED BY 10.15 a.m. Exhibits must not be removed before 3.45 p.m.
- 9 The committee will not hold themselves responsible for loss or damage to property of exhibitors.
- 10 The prizes will be paid by the Hon. Treasurer at the Show.
- 11 No unauthorised person to be allowed in the Show while judging is in progress.
- 12 Judging to be under Royal Horticultural Society's Rules. Judge's decision is final.
- 13 One entry, per person, per class.

FRUIT	Apples	- keep stalks intact.
	Plums	- stalks intact and keep bloom.
	Berries	- keep green stalks and calyx.
VEGETABLES	Beans	 cut from plant leaving short stalk.
	Courgettes	- 4"-6" in length.
	Marrows	- table ones max 15" in length.
	Shallots and Onions	- do not remove too many outer
		layers, tie tops and trim roots.
	Leeks	- leave approx 4" green top.
	Tomatoes	 leave calyx on, as ripe as possible.
FLORAL ART	- stick to size specified. No height restrictions.	
COOKERY	Victoria Sponge	- use raspberry jam. no butter cream.
	Cakes, Pastries, etc	 on paper plate covered with polythene bag.
JAMS	- fill to top of jar.	
DRINKS	 must be accompanied by a glass. Screwtop or plastic removable corks if possible.

RECIPE - Pineapple, Coconut & Fruit Loaf

Ingredients:

150g self-raising flour	2 eggs
75g desiccated coconut	227/230g can pineapple chunks in juice, chopped
75g caster sugar	75g dried mixed fruit
110g softened butter	2 tbsp granulated sugar

Method:

Heat oven to 190C / Fan 170C/ Gas 5. Line 2lb/900g loaf tin. Mix together flour, 50g coconut, caster sugar, butter and eggs. Fold in pineapple chunks (reserve juice) and dried fruit. Spoon into prepared tin and smooth top. Sprinkle with remaining coconut. Bake for approximately 40-45 mins (cover with foil if browning too quickly).

Mix 5 tbsp pineapple juice with granulated sugar and spoon over cake as soon as it comes out of oven. Leave to cool in tin for ten mins, before cooling on wire rack.
