OUTCOMES OF THE VILLAGE OPEN DAY

The Planning Group would like to thank the 25 Groups and Organisations who took part with well- presented displays and having representatives to talk to people. All who came seemed to enjoy meeting up, talking and having a cream tea and drinks from the bar while Stuart and Andrew organised non- stop activities on the MUGA which kept children happy.

The proposed veranda at the Hut was marked out and a floor plan showing patio doors & disabled access along with ideas for updating the interior were all on display.

Everyone had the opportunity to vote for the projects thought to be of most benefit to our community to decide priorities for funding applications. The Hut update and Bar Extension had the highest ratings repairing the Chattisham Play Equipment had twice as many votes as the gazebo. Accessible parking for the Hall is already underway.

What's going to happen as a result of the Open Day?

Men's Shed /Repair Shop: a meeting has been arranged at the Community Hall with Suffolk Foundation speakers to gauge interest in starting a Shed here on Wed 8 June 10 -12am and a visit to Debenham's Shed in shipping containers on Fri 10 June. All welcome.

Proposed After School Meet up: On the Field/ Play area for a trial of drinks & snacks served from the Hut to start after half term.

Toddler Group: Meet up before the school children arrive, using the Hut and play area and meeting other young families. They have also been invited to visit the school.

The Teenagers: Are hoping to start meeting up on a Friday evening later in June/July after exams to see how it works.

A Working Group: Is being set up to consider plans for the Hut update and Bar Extension, get outline costings and find out about Professional Fundraisers with aim of making decisions by the end of summer.

In early March, as well as Pigeons, we had Blackbirds, Robins and Blue tits nesting. Some Moorhens had eggs in a large conifer at the back of the garden. Climate change has gone mad. For the first time in a few years there has been no killer virus in our finch population. Michael clearing up after some storm damage, found three baby Robins in two fallen trees but with some adjustment they survived and fledged. Unfortunately, not so good news about the Moorhen eggs as the crows took them. There were two nests of Pheasant eggs in the garden so hoping for good results there. The farmer has sown a few acres of fields to bird seed so that is a good result for nature.



On March 26th we had a Parakeet in a tree at the front. It was green with a long tail, large and very noisy. Have you lost one? I tried to catch it but no luck.

We still see the Red Kite flying around the village and we also saw a fox in the garden – the first one for three years. Thanks to all who give us information about the reptiles in our village.

Racing Pigeons always had young squabs in early January. Many years ago I bred and raced The Little Mite, so named as she was a very tiny hen bird. She went on to win The King's Cup which was a 486 mile race from Lerwick in the Shetland Isles to home. We were offered £6000 for her which was a fortune then but we kept her till she passed on.

Many of you ask about Bertie so here is another of his Essex quotes: "Hedges if you let grow turn to trees, but trees don't turn to hedges". Please remember that we should not cut down hedges between the 1st of March and September as this is the main nesting time for birds and other animal breeding.

Avian Flu restrictions were lifted at the beginning of May, just in time for the geese. The female was sitting on a clutch of eggs and woe betide anyone who got too close!
