Parish Council Meeting Notes

Notes from the meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 8th February 2024

Report(s) from County and District Councillors and Members of the public in attendance.

Cllr John Whyman - discussed how he had been following up on local action themes for Hintlesham and Chattisham including road drainage problems in Chattisham, assisting with Timperley Residents fencing and following up BDC planning items discussed in Januarys PC meeting. Highways have investigated the drainage problems and report that more complex work is required to address the issue.

Babergh is likely to receive additional monies from the government which would likely go straight to Suffolk County Council. Babergh District Council continue to face significant financial challenges over the next 24/36 months.

BDC's consideration for car parking charges moves ahead and the cabinet have made recommendations to consult, analyse and understand the value of parking facilities in our local parish's before recommendations are put forward for consideration.

Cllr Hudson was not in attendance but forwarded information from Highways regarding road closure in Aldham - due to the verge and part of the road collapsing the road is to remain closed for the next few months for road user safety, until permanent repair has taken place.

There were no reports or comments from members of the public in attendance. Correspondence had been received from a village resident concerning disruption caused by an extremely loud motor vehicle driven locally.
