Notes from the meeting of the Parish Council held in the Community Hall Meeting Room on Thursday 14th April 2022

Matters Arising - Several points came up following the previous Council meeting. Les (Cole), PC Chair following the the Council's motion in February to 'nudge' the Community Council into looking, more urgently, at the provision of appropriate disability parking adjacent to the village hall entrance. Les reported back from a meeting he had held with Tym Moore (HCCC Chair) and Linda Jones (HCCC Secretary) concerning their agreement to accelerate this project albeit they stated that there was no legal requirement to do so. Each HCCC are now obtaining 3 quotes for this work and are considering suitable surfaces. Councillors thanked Les for the expeditious manner in which he had dealt with this matter. Councillors reaffirmed their desire to help financially contribute to this project subject to it being appropriately scrutinised by BDC for Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) support. Les confirmed that he would continue to monitor progress and liaise with HCCC.

District Councillor – Dave Busby gave us an update on District Council activities. Dave confirmed the emerging details of the National Grid 'Green Line' pylon line that may and likely will emerge to run between Capel St Mary and Wenham. Watch this space as we really need to keep an eye on the cumulative impact of electricity transmission lines around our villages over the next 5-10 years that are being scoped and planned right now. Peter Eton asked David to provide an update on the 'Hook Lane' development. Roger Chase, one of the esteemed retired PC Chairs articulated his concerns at the Babergh Planning Committee debate (available online via You Tube) that had taken place recently concerning the planning application by Hintlesham Hall Golf Club to build 5 dwellings adjacent to the clubhouse to raise capital for their business. Roger questioned the credibility and substance of the debate between the attending councillors and their apparent disregard for both local planning policy and the technical direction offered by the Acting Chief Planning Officer and planning support team. Richard Young also questioned the voting process undertaken at this planning meeting where District Councillors seemed as though they didn't quite appreciate what they were voting for when the decision was called. Davis also confirmed to us that he had, along with several other 'non-conservative' Councillors, resigned from the Babergh Council Cabinet.

County Councillor- Christopher Hudson. Apologies given, no report made

Public Comments – Peter Beal raised the poor condition of the pathway from opposite Hintlesham Hall entrance down Wilderness Hill – The pathway is potentially quite dangerous for pedestrians and particularly parents with young children and prams/pushchairs. Councillors

echoed their disquiet at the poor ongoing maintenance afforded to public infrastructure by Suffolk County Council to both roads and pathways.

DC/22/1603- Rosslyn House (Rosslyn South Site) Duke St Hintlesham. Full Revised Application for the erection of 1 single storey dwelling (Amended scheme from approved application (DC/20/05873)

DC/22/0519- Discharge of Conditions Application DC/18/05613 - No comment made by Council- Discharge of conditions Noted.

DC/22/01791- Glenhaven, Silver Hill Hintlesham. Discharge of Conditions Application DC/22/00371- No comment made by Council- Discharge of Conditions Noted.

Les read through the planning permissions granted and planning permission refusals made in the past month.

We were reminded of the upcoming Parish meeting for both Hintlesham and Chattisham – 12th May and 19th May respectively.

Community Infrastructure Levy- Tamsin (our Parish Clerk) requested Councillors consider opening an additional bank account to manage the growing 'capital' accruing from CIL payments to ensure complete separation from existing operational finances and to provide increased transparency on how CIL monies are spent. Councillors agreed to this request subject to ensuring the bank charges for the operation of the account are minimised.

Bramford – Twinstead Pylon Line – Peter Eaton updated Councillors on the latest position and briefed those Councillors that didn't attend the 'Ask the Expert' meeting held with National Grid. Peter reaffirmed his urge to the entire community of the cumulative impact of both this line , and its pathway through the village, and also the Green Line project which is currently being considered.

Parish Infrastructure Investment Plan (PIIP) - Les reminded Councillors of this on-going project to create a working group (Di Chase Ian Bryce Steph Coupland and himself that they would be dealing with this from June onwards and reporting back to Council.

The full meeting minutes of this meeting will be published and available to view on the village website.
