

Dear Friends

We thought it might be helpful to share a little of our new Bishop's opening address to the Diocesan Synod (Governing body of the church), so that you have a picture of who he is and the task ahead of us as a Diocese:

'It is an immense privilege and joy for me to be here to serve you. I realise we have some massive and daunting challenges to face. The time is long past when we can hope they don't apply to us or will magically disappear. They won't. The challenges are shared nationally - indeed dimensions of them affect the life of the church across Western Europe - but they are also local, and have their own particular, and I would say severe, Suffolk form. But they are the reason why I am here. If everything was hunky dory and plain sailing I would not have allowed myself to be considered for this post. I am here for the challenge.

But I have seen many of the reasons why

the challenges are just one aspect of life in this diocese, and need to be held in perspective. *I have also been* shown the energy and passion, the imagination and creativity, and the deep faith - and sense of fun - of people across the diocese. This is all evidence to me of God's present and lively call to us for renewal and hope. And God is calling us, through the ministry, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus and the working of the Spirit, not first to do something but to become something, to become the people, the congregations and the Diocese that God is calling us to be. That is the source of my excitement, that God is very close to us, and is drawing us, calling us to become more than we imagined possible, to God's glory and the flourishing of the people of this county. I will start to draw some shape to the vision - that we can all recognise - and some shape to the strategy we need to be able to move towards it. Of course the most important part of this is prayer, the prayer of attention and discernment, and I will ask all of us to be involved in that. The only vision we seek after all is God's vision for us, for the church in this county, and most importantly for the people of this county. We seek that in prayer, study and conversation.'

And so can we encourage you to pray for clarity of God's vision for us all

Waste and Recycling - Update

What items I can recycle?

Since November last year you have been able to recycle even more in your recycling bin – with cartons, aerosols, books and metal pots, pans & trays now being accepted.

This is in addition to the items you were already able to recycle such as paper, card, metal cans, aluminium foil, textiles and plastic bottles, tubs and trays. The fantastic news is

that we have recycled 325 more tonnes from November to January compared with the same period last year, including 95 tonnes (that's approximately 3.4 million!) of cartons. While the focus has been on the new items that can be recycled, there are some things that can't be recycled through our scheme that we would like to remind about and explain why it is important that they are not put into your recycling bin.

Carrier bags and other plastic bags are often put into recycling bins in error; as they can't be recycled through our scheme. Carrier bags are made from a number of different types of plastic. To recycle the carrier bags the different types of plastics would have to be separated from each other which can be difficult and expensive. Some carrier bags are also degradable or compostable which makes it even more complicated as these types cannot be recycled. Carrier bags and plastic wrapping (e.g. cling film) can also get tangled round the machinery at our plant. Please do not put any carrier bags into your recycling bin. The below advice can be followed:

Reduce: When you go shopping don't accept unwanted plastic bags – take reusable bags with you.

Reuse: Plastic bags can be reused as bin liners or dog litter bags. Some charity shops may accept plastic bags for reuse.

Recycle: Plastic bags and film can be recycled at any Suffolk Household Waste Recycling Centre. Most larger branches of leading supermarkets also have collection bins for plastic bags, food bags and plastic film but you will need to check in store in advance. (They can't be put in your kerbside recycling bin)

Crisp packets, biscuit and sweet wrappers are made from a plastic that cannot currently be recycled and are not accepted in our recycling bins, so please put them into your rubbish bin.
